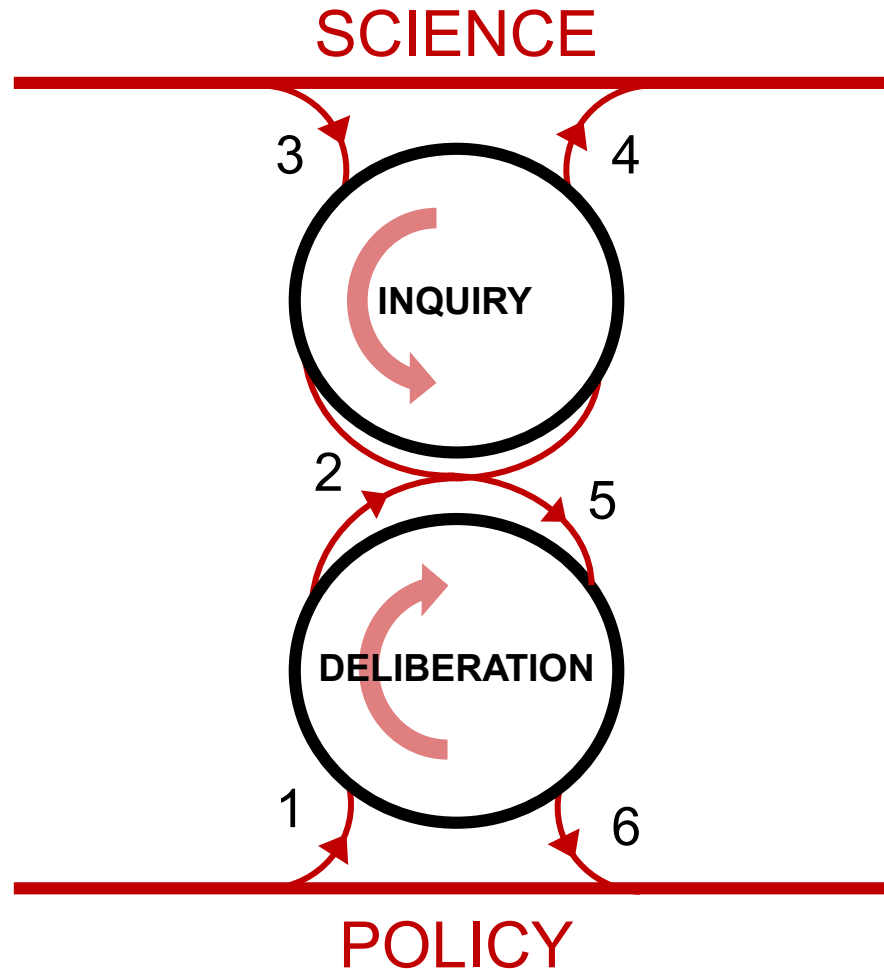

# A Deliberative Inquiry Approach to the Science / Policy Interface

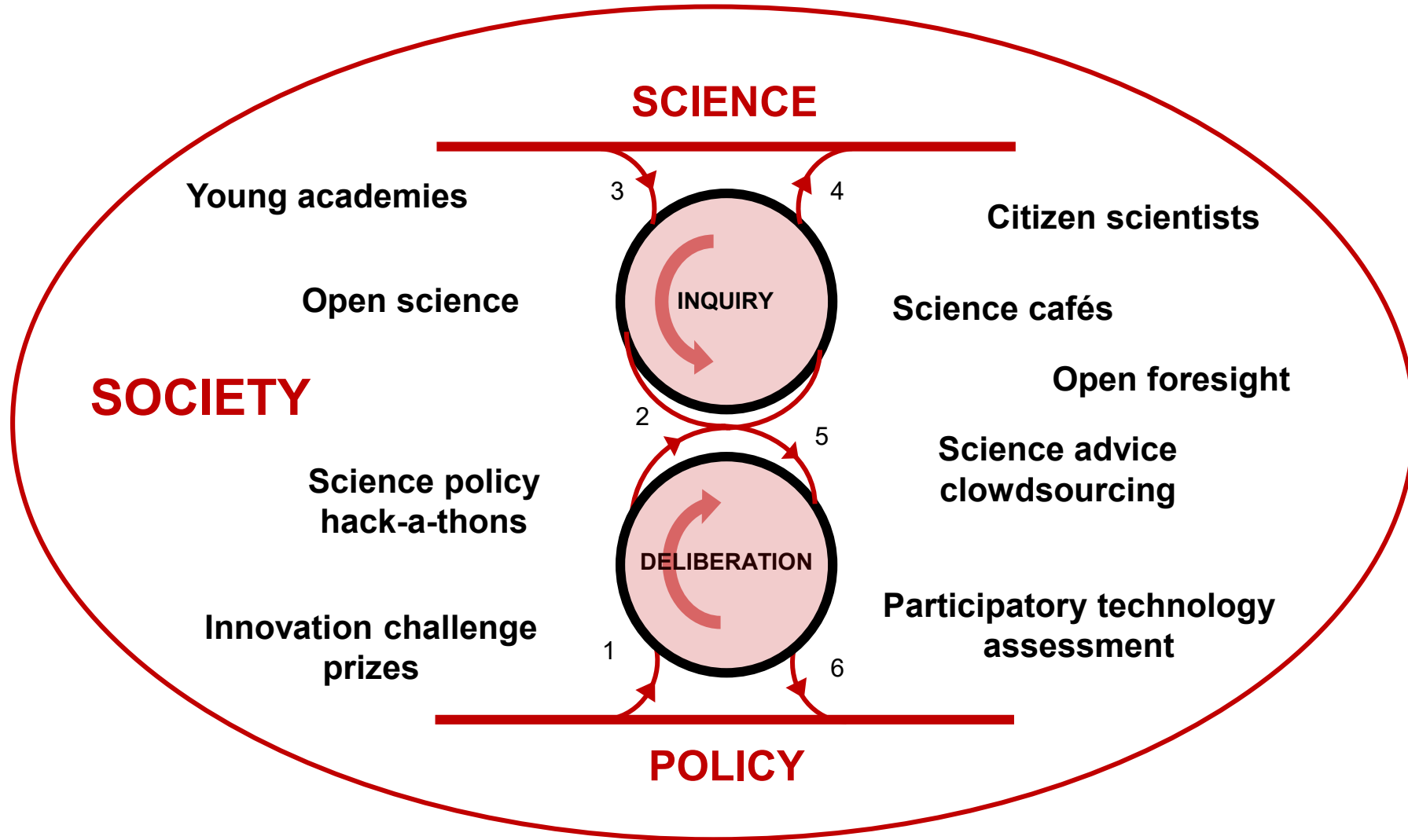


The model is represented as two cycles representing **inquiry** and **deliberation**, linked so that both turn together in a coordinated and mutually supportive way. The numbered elements of the model do not necessarily represent a linear sequence; aspects of each element can take place at any time through the process.
